Interactive live demonstrations will be presented on cross-cut sawing, ice-fishing, and fly-tying with Trout Unlimited.

This year we welcome the Oneida Indian Nation in celebration of traditional Haudenosaunee winter activities. Jessica Farmer, Cultural Programs Coordinator at the Shako:wi Cultural Center, will lead groups in basket weaving and incorporate oral storytelling traditions.

The celebration will also include the debut of the newly constructed Maple Sugar Shack, a heritage collaboration with the Chenango County Historical Society, in partnership with Clear Path for Veterans and the DCMO BOCES Carpentry program. All are invited to experience the next phase of this exciting community partnership and the interactive living history exhibit. Ribbon cutting at 11:30 am.
