WHO WE ARE

The formation of ChenTAC was established due to the ever-changing risks of targeted violence and mass shootings that society faces today. ChenTAC takes effective proactive and protective measures that are designed to prevent, not predict, potential acts of targeted violence and terrorism. Through identifying and managing potential threats, ChenTAC provides alternatives to investigation and /or prosecution for bystanders who are actively seeking intervention assistance with a known individual at risk of mobilizing to violence.

With the support of the Chenango County Sheriff's Office, ChenTAC is a multidisciplinary team comprised of businesses, schools and colleges, social service agencies, mental health professionals, faith based organizations, community resources and local and state law enforcement. Collectively, we convene as a confidential group to identify, assess and manage potential threats of targeted violence.

IMPORTANT DEFINITION

Targeted Violence is premeditated violence and is usually directed at a specific individual, group, or location. A perpetrator of targeted violence is typically responding to a perceived grievance or acting on behalf of a particular ideology. **Targeted Violence** is different from impulsive, reactive, or emotional acts of violence. Some examples of targeted violence are school shootings, workplace violence, domestic violence, stalking, and terroristic attacks.
