

ANIMALS

BEEF CATTLE

Did you know New York State has nearly 12,800 cattle farms with 1.4 million cattle and calves overall, including almost

110,000 beef cows supplying nutritious, wholesome beef to consumers?

The beef industry is one of the top five agricultural sectors in



New York with 92% of New York beef farms being family owned and operated. These hard-working and dedicated men and women tend to their cattle all year in preparation for the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair.

Beef cattle exhibitors spend countless hours working with their livestock, feeding, washing and teaching calves to walk in the show ring, to present their cattle to the best of their ability on show day. Be sure to swing by the show barn to see their hard work on display!

DAIRY, AN IMPORTANT PART OF AGRICULTURE

Dairy livestock will be on exhibit during the week of the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair beginning Tuesday, August 5th through Sunday, August 10th.

Whether you live in the country or the middle of town, the fair gives everyone the opportunity to see the many



different aspects of agriculture. During the fair, the dairy barn will be full of dairy cattle and people willing to share what it

takes to care for these animals. Farmers work hard every day and the fair gives them the opportunity to share this experience with the community. They do this by answering questions to better educate the community about dairy farming and all that is required.

Dairy shows are scheduled for Wednesday and Friday. These shows provide exhibitors the opportunity to demonstrate their hard work and commitment they have done throughout the year. You will hear about the major characteristics that the judge is looking for in the animals to determine how to rank them during the competition. Junior exhibitors compete in Showmanship classes demonstrating how well they "fit and prepare" their animals for the show and their knowledge of showing dairy animals. Showmanship is a competition between the exhibitors, while the dairy classes are focused on the characteristics of the animals and which ones portray the best traits for the dairy breed the animal represents.

Come see the dairy cows again this year every day of the fair. Take the time to visit with your friends and neighbors, as they take time to share their lifestyle with the community.

GOATS

Did you know goats are known to be one of the oldest domesticated animals, being domesticated in the Fertile Crescent roughly 10,000 years ago?

Today, there are more than 200 recognized domestic goat breeds. There are three types of domestic goats – dairy, meat and fiber producing, all



of which can be shown at the fair.

Their friendly nature makes them one of the more popular animals for children to show at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair.

Dairy goats are judged based on their udder quality, breed characteristics and confirmation just like a dairy cow. Goat milk is commonly made into yogurt, cheese, soap, creams and many more products.

Meat goats are judged on confirmation, muscling and market readiness. Although it is a less popular meat in the United States, goat is a delicacy for many cultures.

Goat exhibitors at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair work hard to prepare their goats for the fair. Beginning in the spring, they handle their livestock daily, allowing them to become accustomed to people and being in a show collar. To see these curious little creatures, stop by the goat barn at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair!

HORSE SHOWS AT THE SCHOHARIE COUNTY SUNSHINE FAIR

Six consecutive days of horse shows. There are shows going all six days at the Sunshine Fair, and there is something for everyone to watch.

There will be Draft Horses on Display all week. Come and take a look.

The New York State Sire Harness Racing starts the



Fair at 12.00 PM on Tuesday. This is a BIG event with lots of speed.

The Sanctioned NBHA Barrel Race Come and watch the horses and riders turn and burn.

DONKEY AND MULE SHOW

Come watch in the Superior Housing Arena the Donkey and Mule Show. This show is growing by leaps and bounds with exhibitors and spectators both. There

are three distinct divisions at the show to include Miniature Donkeys, Standard & Mammoth Donkeys, and Mules & hybrids.




We are starting the event with the very popular spectator sport of Coon Jumping! The animals compete against each other by jumping an obstacle from a standstill! This originated from when farmers would hunt Raccoons (to help keep raccoon damage to cornfields a

minimum). Followed by timed obstacles, pleasure riding and driving. Spicing things up will be the Cloverleaf Barrel race, with some shown under saddle and others driving. To showcase the natural beauty and gaits of donkeys and mules, Liberty class is offered this year – so tap your toes to the music and cheer on your favorite long eared friend! Halter and Showmanship will be included in the show. Our enthusiastic exhibitors work all year long to come up with just the most interesting Costumes, for a special class where both Exhibitor and donkey & mules dress in theme! And because donkeys and mules just love to roll in dirt, the "First to Roll" contest wraps up the event. Good for a laugh, with vocal donkeys and exhibitors. Come have fun and watch the action!



RABBITS

If you are looking for adorable entertainment, hop into the livestock barn to see fluffy rabbits and their owners. You will find rabbits of all colors and sizes on display at the Sunshine fair. Did you know rabbits can be trained to use a litter box or that many rabbits like to play with balls and toys? Rabbits also can be trained to walk on a leash just like a dog. The bunnies seen at the fair will be shown based on their confirmation and breed standard, fiber and cleanliness. Rabbits are raised for both their meat and hair, depending on their breed. You can stop in and watch the rabbit show, where exhibitors will hold their rabbits on a table for a judge. There will be a Rabbit Hopping Contest for all Rabbits. Rabbit owners from all over the county are always near to answer your questions about their favorite pets.

SHEEP

Do you enjoy a delicious lamb roast for a Sunday family dinner? Or maybe you love a warm wool sweater on a chilly winter day. Sheep farmers all over the county help to make those things possible.

They work hard all year feeding, handling and shear-

ing their sheep to produce meat,

and wool. Once a year at the Schoharie Sunshine Fair, these farmers have the opportunity to exhibit their animals and teach fairgoers all about their farm.

Depending on the breed of the sheep, it will be raised for wool or for meat. Breeds that are typically used for wool production include Romney's, Natural Colored,

Cotswold, and Scottish Blackface.

Dorsets, Suffolks, Cheviots and Southdowns are widely known for their quality meat production.

To prepare for the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair, farmers will start



by shearing off winter wool and working with the animals every day to help them become accustomed to people. In the show ring, judges look for sound skeletal structure, muscling, breed characteristic and depending on the breed, wool quality.

It is something you have to see for yourself, so stop in the sheep barn to

watch a sheep being sheared or fitted and ask one of our exhibitor's questions about their sheep!

SWINE

Being one of the most intelligent animals on the farm, exhibitors from all over the county raise hogs for breeding and market. Did you know pigs can be taught to come when you call their name?



Did you also know that pigs have an excellent sense of smell, and use their snout to navigate the world around them?

These smart creatures are shown in

a fenced in show ring and we can promise you will be thoroughly entertained as you watch their owners guide them around the open ring.

The pigs you see in the barns at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair will be judged for either market or breed quality.

ENTERTAINMENT

MARSHALL TUCKER BAND

Doug Gray – lead vocals, B.B. Borden – drums, Ryan Ware – bass / vocals, Marcus James Henderson – keyboards / saxophone / flute / vocals, Chris Hicks – guitar / vocals and Rick Willis – guitar / vocals When you wake up and want to put a smile on your face, you think of the songs that always manage to reach down and touch your soul the moment you hear the first note. The Marshall Tucker Band is one such group that continues to have a profound level of impact on successive generations of listeners who've been "Searchin' for a Rainbow" and found it perfectly represented by this





tried-and-true Southern institution over the decades. "I've been in tune with how music can make you feel, right from when I was first in the crib," explains lead vocalist and bandleader Doug Gray, who's been fronting the MTB since the very beginning. "I was born with that. And I realized it early on, back when I was a little kid and my mom and dad encouraged me to get up there and sing whatever song came on the jukebox. It got to the point where people were listening to me more than what was on the jukebox! There's a certain gift I found I could share, whether I was in front of five people or 20,000 people. I was blessed with that ability and I'm thankful I can share with others." The Marshall Tucker Band came together as a young, hungry, and quite driven six-piece outfit in Spartanburg, South Carolina in 1972, having duly baptized themselves with the name of a blind piano tuner after they found it inscribed on a key to their original rehearsal space — and they've been in tune with tearing it up on live stages both big and small all across the globe ever since. Plus, the band's mighty music catalog, consisting of more than 20 studio albums and a score of live releases, has racked up multi-platinum album sales many times over. A typically rich MTB setlist is bubbling over with a healthy dose of hits like the heartfelt singalong "Heard It in a Love Song," the insistent pleading of "Can't You See" (the signature tune of MTB's late co-founding lead guitarist and then-



principal songwriter Toy Caldwell), the testifying "Fire on the Mountain," the wanderlust gallop of "Long Hard Ride," and the explosive testimony of "Ramblin," to name but a few. Indeed, the secret ingredient to the ongoing success of The Marshall Tucker Band's influence can be seen and felt far and wide throughout many mainstream digital outlets (Netflix, Amazon, etc.). In essence, it's this inimitable down-home sonic style that helped make the MTB the first truly progressive Southern band to grace this nation's airwaves — the proof of which can be found within the grooves and ever-shifting gears of "Take the Highway," the first song on their self-titled April 1973 debut album on Capricorn Records, The Marshall Tucker Band. "We had the commonality of having all grown up together in Spartanburg," explains Gray about his original MTB bandmates, guitar wizard Toy Caldwell and his brother, bassist Tommy Caldwell, alongside rhythm guitarist George McCorkle, drummer Paul T. Riddle, and flautist/saxophonist Jerry Eubanks. "The framework for Marshall Tucker's music is more like a spaceship than a house," Gray continues, "because you can look out of a lot of windows and see a variety of things that show where we've been and what we've done, and how we've travelled through time to bring those experiences out in all of our songs."

CHUBBY CHECKER KING OF THE TWIST

In 2 minutes and 42 Seconds, Chubby Checker revolutionized popular culture and changed the music business forever. When he appeared on American Bandstand in 1960 and performed "The Twist," it was the dawn of a new era in Rock & Roll.

He stands alone as a one of a kind rock icon, who has had 36 Hit Records, is the only artist to have a single go to # 1 twice, and according to Billboard, has the # 1 si gle for the entire decade of the 60's as well as the first #1 Song of All Time.



Chubby was awarded the first Platinum Single, the first Rock Grammy and has sold a astounding 250,000,000 records over the years. That's why Dick Clark has said: "The three most important things that ever happened in the Music Industry are Elvis Presley, The Beatles, and Chubby Checker."

Every time Chubby steps onto a stage, he demostrates charisma and a unique quality that can never be equaled.

As the most-played group/band on Country Radio in 2023, Parmalee is one of Country Music's most successful acts with four #1 singles, multiple platinum records, and more than 1 Billion on-demand streams. Comprised





of brothers Matt and Scott Thomas (lead vocals/guitar and drums, respectively), Cousin Barry Knox (bass), and life-long friend Josh McSwain (guitar/keyboard), the North Carolina natives first topped the charts with "Carolina," followed by their PLATINUM-certified No. 1 single with Blanco Brown, "Just the Way." They followed with "Take My Name," which was Billboard's Most Played Country Song of 2022. They recently scored their third consecutive #1 single with "Girl In Mine," which is Billboard's 8th Most Played Country Song of 2023. 
RYLEE LUM





FIBER ARTS GALLERY







KIDDIE TRACTOR PULL 2025

The kiddie tractor pull has been an annual event at the Schoharie County Sunshine Fair since 1988. The pedal tractor pull works on the same principle as the "big tractor pulls" except the power comes from the "legs of babes"!

A "mini" weight sled is hooked to a pedal tractor and each child pedals to pull the sled down the track until they make a full pull or run out of power on a 30' track. A full pull entitles the child to another chance, with weight added to the sled, until a winner is determined. There are 5 different "classes" based on the child's weight. The child with the longest distance in each weight class wins. Weight classes are 30-40 lbs, 41-50 lbs, 51-60 lbs, 61-70 lbs, and 71-80 lbs.
